Roles and Responsibilities Principals

Principals of BTS Arts Schools provide leadership for a comprehensive, successful, and sustainable arts learning program for the students in the school; supervise the fidelity of the implementation of the program; and assist advocacy efforts for the sustainability and growth of the program.

- Hire a qualified arts educator designated by the standards listed in Board Rule and in collaboration with the university partner and LEA arts coordinator
- Orient and regularly review BTS Arts roles and responsibilities with faculty
- Create scheduling that complies with grant guidelines by providing arts instruction to every student over the course of the year and adequate planning time for the arts educator, **similar to that of a classroom teacher**
- Provide appropriate teaching space, materials and supplies for art instruction
- Ensure scheduled collaborative planning between the arts educator and grade-level teams

Roles and Responsibilities Arts Teacher

Arts Educators are hired and supervised by the school principal. They provide high quality arts instruction and arts-integrated learning to students in Utah's schools. They work with classroom teachers to create and deliver arts-integrated instruction. They are the primary face of the program at the school level and work to cultivate a school culture that embraces the arts.

- Collaborate with principal, faculty, LEA and regional BTS Arts personnel
- Arts integration, collaborative planning, and collaborative teaching
- Teach 30-90 minute sessions with each class individually and assess student learning
- Collaboratively involve the classroom teacher in the arts/integrated instructional activities
- Ensure scheduled collaborative planning between the arts educator and grade-level teams
- Attend BTS Arts professional development meetings throughout the year and BTS Arts Canvas Course

Roles and Responsibilities Classroom Teachers

Classroom Teachers work collaboratively with the arts educator to plan instruction that integrates the arts and arts concepts with core standards in other subject areas. Ideally, the classroom teacher also teaches side-by-side with the arts educator or participates in the instruction when possible.

- Provide curriculum maps and suggestions for integration to arts educator
- Consistently collaborate with the arts educator for integrated instruction
- Ensure every child attends the arts lessons
- Participate in arts-integrated instruction according to the district plan
- Participate in planning and presentation of school arts events
- Participate in arts-specific professional learning

What is Art Integration?

The arts become the approach to teaching and the vehicle for learning. Students meet dual learning objectives when they engage in the creative process to explore connections between an art form and another subject area to gain deeper learning in both.

For example, students meet objectives in theater (characterization, stage composition, action, expression) and in social studies. The experience is mutually reinforcing — creating a dramatization provides an authentic context for students to learn more about the social studies content and as students delve deeper into the social studies content their growing understandings impact their dramatizations.

For Arts-Integrated Curriculum to result in deep student understanding in both the art form and the other curriculum area, it requires that teachers engage in professional learning to learn about arts standards and how to connect the arts to the curriculum they teach.

These universities have received funding for a professional position to further elementary arts education in Utah's schools.

BTS Arts Quick Start Checklist

BTS Arts Educator

- Should hold professional license and artform-specific endorsement
- □ Is part of school faculty, with same rights and responsibilities

Schedule

- Each class has its own regularly scheduled arts time
- Every student participates
- □ Instruction time at least 30 minutes, ideally 45 90 minutes
- Transition time built in, at least 5 minutes between classes
- Prep time for arts educator
- Collaborative planning time with classroom teachers

Provide

- Arts classroom, when possible
- Supplies, materials according to art form
- Computer
- Storage space
- Curriculum maps

Advocate

- Hang BTS Arts banner, posters
- □ Support annual arts event in school
- Allow BTS Arts educators to present in faculty meeting at the beginning of the school year
- Support arts educator in attending professional learning provided by university partner
