A comprehensive workshop designed to equip educators with practical strategies to transform classrooms into calm, productive learning environments. Participants will explore evidence-based techniques to manage student behavior, foster positive relationships, and create a structured yet flexible classroom atmosphere. Gain the confidence and skills needed to handle disruptions effectively and promote a culture of respect and engagement.

This one-day course provides foundational knowledge and skills in individualized behavioral assessment and intervention to support students with persistent challenging behavior, focusing on data collection, analysis, and practical classroom strategies.

Paraeducator/Teacher Teams, will participate in a half-day AI workshop focused on practical strategies and information sharing to support K-12 students with varied needs and abilities, specifically designed for educators working in special education settings.

The U-TTEC Lab Program is a one-day, in-person training designed to support paraprofessionals in building strong student relationships, managing behavior through trauma-informed practices, and prioritizing personal wellbeing. Participants will gain practical tools to foster responsive, and compassionate classroom environments.
