- I. Salaries (Object Codes 100-199)
 - A. See the Salary Forecast Report for your program. This report, which should match the related budget codes on your budget worksheets, reflects the current contract pay and already excludes the \$2,500 and \$8,904 Educator Salary Adjustment.
 - B. The teacher in-service rate is \$34.29 per hour.
 - C. Any additional FTE will need prior approval from the Deputy Superintendent for Business Services and must be noted on the budget worksheet.
- II. Fringe Benefits (Object Codes 200-299)
 - A. Social Security: 6.20% (object code 220).
 - B. Medicare: 1.45% (object code 221).
 - C. Retirement: (object code 210)
 - 1. Hired before July 1, 2011 23.69% (Tier I)
 - 2. Hired after June 30, 2011 20.02% (Tier II)
 - D. Disability Insurance: \$13.05 per month or \$156.60 per year (object code 251).
 - E. Health and Life Insurance: \$1,162.00 per month or \$13,944 per year (object code 241). If a benefited employee does not take health insurance, the amount is \$15 per month or \$180 per year.
 - F. Industrial Accident Insurance: 0.1% (.001 multiplier) (object code 270).
- III. Other Operating Expenses (Object Codes 300-899)
 - A. Restricted-use programs (usually state or federally funded programs such as Special Education, Title I, CTE, Concurrent Enrollment, etc.) are to be budgeted so the programs are self-sufficient (revenues equal expenses).
 - Federal programs (generally program codes 7000-7999 and always revenue function codes 4xxx) will be charged an indirect rate per State guidelines.
 Eligible state program (generally program codes 5000-5999 and always revenue function codes 3xxx) will also be charged an indirect rate per State guidelines.
 - a. Restricted Rate programs 2.03% for object code 870
 - b. Unrestricted Rate programs 11.66% for object code 860
 - B. Non-restricted-use programs (usually locally funded programs and departments) may not budget an increase in the <u>total</u> of object codes 300-899 from the same codes in the prior year without the approval of the deputy superintendent for Business Services. Additionally, increases to discretionary wages require approval from the deputy superintendent for Business Services.

 - F. Cell phone reimbursement (object code 531) is 10¢ per minute/text message for peak hours (no reimbursement for off-peak hours) limited to:
 - 1. The total bill;
 - 2. \$50 overall (includes minutes and texts); and/or
 - 3. \$10 for text messages alone.
 - 4. No administrator may receive cell phone reimbursement or district-provided cell phone service.
