

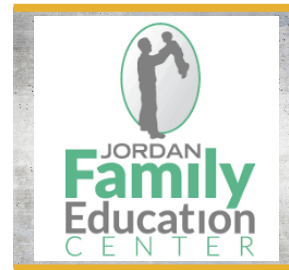

Getting students to school each day can be very challenging for parents/guardians, especially if they are working. We would like to help you work through your challenges so your student can attend each day and do the best they are able to in school.



WE HAVE RESOURCES TO HELP YOU

Jordan School District provides classes to help families with mental health at the Jordan Family Education Center. Some of the classes offered are: anger management, parenting, social skills, bullying, substance abuse, divorce, and more. The Jordan Family Education Center is staffed by school psychologists, school counselors, school psychology interns and social workers employed by Jordan School District to help you and your child. They also provide short-term, child-centered counseling for families whose children are enrolled in Jordan School District. The JFEC is funded by Jordan School District; therefore, these are offered at no cost to you.

TRANSPORTATION TO OR FROM SCHOOL?
