Mental Health Access Program (MHAP)

For the 2020-21 school year our District has received <u>substantial</u> funds to meet student's mental health needs through our Mental Health Access Program (MHAP). We encourage schools to refer <u>any</u> student or family that would benefit from these services. There is no limit for any one school and the District will be able to accommodate all needs-based referrals.

What is MHAP?

- Jordan District has contracted with 13 community mental health providers (<u>click</u> <u>here for the MHAP MAP</u>) with a variety of expertise. Each family referred has many options to determine what best meets their family's mental health needs.
- The first \$800 for each family referred is covered by a grant regardless of their insurance or financial status.
- Families referred are able to begin services within 10 days!
- Families can receive individual therapy, family therapy, medication evaluations (for students who might be in need of mental health medications) and medication follow up visits through MHAP.
- <u>Any</u> student is eligible based on school referrals, regardless of their circumstances, though MHAP is meant for students who otherwise would not be able to access mental health services.

How do I refer a student/family to MHAP?
